



Introduction

Welcome to "All Shapes and Sizes," an RE assemblies guide. In approaching RE assemblies, it is good to start where the children are - in school. Helping children engage with life through linking their school education with Christian Bible stories, is the basis of this series. Any assembly leader can present these RE assemblies, regardless of their knowledge of Christian traditions. This can also be presented with a team of up to five people.

The theme of this book is *"Living in This World"* - an essential aspect of life. The topic is "Shapes" - an important part of learning. Add these two together with a big plus sign of FUN and INTERACTION, equals an exciting way for children to INVESTIGATE LIFE. Children begin to engage with their present world.



There are eighteen shapes to explore, along with Bible stories to illustrate each shape. The assemblies are presented in a multi-sensory way so every child can engage in the way they learn best. Every child deserves the opportunity to step from their intellect to their hearts. In these assemblies they are given time to focus on their personal world.

Each assembly lasts fifteen minutes and has the same basic structure. They can be given in any order, as best suits the leader. Each assembly has its own "Shape Card" that sums up the assembly. But please feel free to adjust each assembly as best suits you.

Here is the "memory line" for this assemblies' series. Bring it out from time to time so the children can learn it through games and races.

Basic Structure for a 15 minute RE Assembly

Sing: As the children file into the hall, sing some songs.

Welcome: (½ minute) Introduce the RE Assembly Team.

Introduce Theme with Puppets: (1 minute)

The puppets introduce the theme using role play. The puppets explain some personal dilemma that needs solving.

Introduce Bible Time Line: (1½ minute)

Have two children hold a string, like a clothes line. Attach the downloadable "Shape Card" for that assembly with a clothes peg. Add a new "Shape Card" at the beginning of each new assembly.



Bible Story (Spontaneous Drama): (8 minutes)

Present the story by:

- A simple dramatized reading of the story.
- A spontaneous drama in which various children can participate as characters in the

story. They may be chosen before the story begins. On the stage they should be guided from place to place as the story unfolds.

- Various props are suggested for each assembly.
- Various pictures can be downloaded for individual assemblies.

Reflective Time with Puppets: (2 minutes)

Ask about the feeling that came up in the story. Various children will want to respond. Choose three or four share with the group. Always thank the child for their contribution. Always take seriously what they say.

Prayer: (½ minute)

The RE Assembly leader may tell the children, "I shall say a prayer. If you want, you may join in at the end by saying 'Amen.'"

Closing Theme Song: (1 minutes)





Materials Needed for RE Assemblies

Remember to arrive early and set up!

What to bring to every assembly:

- String for Time Line and clothes pegs
- "Shape Card" for each assembly
- Puppets
- Safety pins, tape, string
- Name Badges for each one on the assembly team
- Words for songs: memory stick, or acetates for an Overhead Projector

What to have on hand in your cupboard for the various assemblies:

– Lengths of fabric between 3 - 5 meters long.

Non wrinkly, easily washable fabrics best, like polyester.

These make excellent backdrops, boats, mountains, cloaks, rivers...

Bright solid colours are best...red, brown, blue, purple, white, green...

- Laminator for all Number Cards and paper items that will get used again
- Swords (wooden spoons, or the inside cardboard roll in wrapping paper)
- Armour, and helmets (the good old plastic kind)
- Plastic cups to hit together they make a great horse or donkey sounds.



Theme 1: ARCH TO SEE – Things Go Wrong

Welcome: MC welcomes children, introduces Fun Fish and theme. Memory Line: "For everything God made is good." (1 Timothy 4:4) Sing a Song:

Puppet Introduces Theme: Use a washing line, clothes pegs, three event picture and "ARCH to see" card. Memory Line

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "Noah and the Ark" (Genesis 6 – 9)

Materials needed:

Plastic hammer Cardboard tubes as wood (like in wrapping paper) Bags of food stored for the trip, Lantern to see in the boat Rainbow, Cuddly animals Brown cloth for boat, Blue cloth for water Building Plans for boat Cast: Narrator God Noah and family

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): Sometimes things go wrong, but we can be prepared. In school we practice how to leave the building safely and quickly. We can think about the best way to get out of our homes if there was a disaster. Maybe you can go home and talk about it with your family. When you see a rainbow, remember, you can always be prepared.

Short Prayer: "Dear God, sometimes things go wrong. Please help us to think ahead and be prepared. Amen."

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know...say "Be Prepared." ...

Story 1: Noah and the Ark (Genesis 6-8)

In the beginning God made the world and the world was good. People were good. But something changed. People started fighting, cheating, and doing mean things. God looked around and sighed. "I'm sorry I made this world."

But God noticed one man. This man was good and kind. "Noah," God called, "The world is in trouble. Please build a boat. Here are the plans."

Noah looked at the plans. He scratched his head. This was an awfully big boat. So he called his wife, his three boys and their wives. They had a family meeting. "Listen to me, family. God told me to build a boat. Let's do it together."

The sons and wives nodded their heads. "Looks like fun. Let's start now."

They chopped down trees. They made long boards. They nailed them together. They built the biggest, tallest, longest, widest boat on earth.

Then Noah and his family filled it with food. They cut grass and picked nuts. They found honey and figs. Soon everything was ready. But ready for what?!

Theme 2: CUBES TO STACK – People are Different

Welcome: MC welcomes children, introduces Fun Fish and theme. Memory Line: "For everything God made is good." (1 Timothy 4:4) Sing a Song:

Puppet Introduces Theme: Two puppets speak hold a rope for the shape line. One puts on the three main markers in the Bible: Creation, Christmas, and Easter. Talk about all of us being different, just like shapes.

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): Tower of Babel (Genesis 11)

Materials needed:

Ice cream buckets with lids or very big blocks to build a tower Green cloth for a field

Wooden spoons for spades

Cast: Narrator God Clever man Leader Children to help build the tower

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): How many of us can say hello in a different language? We are all special, all different.

Short Prayer: "Dear God, thank you that you made us all different and special. Amen."

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know...say "We're special." ...

Story 2: The Tower of Babel (Genesis 11 in the Bible)

In the Beginning everyone spoke the same language. It didn't matter where you went, everyone knew what you said. But soon there were so many people, they moved to great, wide plain. It was so flat and they could see for miles.

But then they discovered they had a problem. There was no stone to build their houses, just mud, mud, everywhere. "I have an idea," said a clever man. "Let's make bricks."

Everyone scratched their heads. "What a crazy idea! Will it work?"

The clever man laughed. "It won't, if you don't try."

So the people made bricks and baked them hard. Then they built houses, barns and shops. But soon there was nothing else left to build.

"We like building," said the people. "What shall we do next?"

The clever man stood on a box so everyone could hear him speak. "Let's build a tower that reaches to the sky. Then we will be famous, and always stay together."

Memory Line: "For everything God made is good." (1 Timothy 4:4) Welcome: MC welcomes children, introduces Fun Fish and theme. Sing a Song:

Puppet Introduces Theme: Use a washing line, clothes pegs, three event picture and "SEEDS to Plant" card. Memory Line

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "Seeds to Plant" (Matthew 13: 3 – 9)

Materials needed:

Corn stalk (if you can find one in a garden somewhere) Corn on the cob Corn seed Watering can Stone Weeds

Cast: narrator

Farmer

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): Why is it good to be generous? What are some good things we can give to others?

Short Prayer: "Dear God, help us to be generous and help others when they are in need. Amen"

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know...Give to all ...

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Story 3: "Seeds to Plant" (Matthew 13: 3 – 9)

There is a harvest story from long ago, but it is still true today. It is about a clever farmer, amazing seeds, and generosity. It takes all three to have a harvest.

Let's hear that story...

What if there was a farmer who planted a corn seed on a path? Every time he walked down that path, he would step on it. It didn't matter how much he watered the seed, it would never have a chance to grow. No seed can grow on a path.

What if that farmer planted that corn seed on a rock? He watered it. He sat down beside all day long, watching it. "Grow seed, grow!" he could say, trying to help it along. But that seed would never grow. No seed can grow on a rock.

What if that farmer planted his corn seed in weeds? That seed wouldn't grow. The weeds would take all the sunlight and rain. No seed can grow in weeds.

But the farmer is clever. He takes his corn seed and plants it in good soil. He waters it, and it grows, and grows and grows. Every corn seed can grow in good soil.

That clever farmer knows a secret as well. He knows that a corn seed is amazing. When that one little corn seed grows up, the farmer won't find just one little corn seed on a stalk, he will find one, two, three, four, five ears of corn.

"Hurray!" he shouts as he picks the corn.

He sits down and opens one ear. It has hundreds of seeds inside. "What a harvest!" he shouts. "Now I can share this food with everyone. Everyone will have plenty to eat."

Harvest is about a clever farmer, amazing seeds, and generosity. Let's all be like that farmer and seed, clever and generous in everything we do.

Welcome: MC welcomes children, introduces Fun Fish and theme. Every child in the world is precious. I am precious.Memory Line: "For everything God made is good." (1 Timothy 4:4)Sing a Song:

Puppet Introduces Theme: Use a washing line, clothes pegs, three event picture and "STARS to Count" card. Memory Line

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "Stars to Count" (Genesis 12 – 15)

Materials needed:

- Cloth and chairs for two tents to move from one side to the other Doll wrapped up in blanket Some cuddly animals
- White cloth for God

Cast: Narrator God

Abraham Sarah Lot

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): What makes a child precious? Their eyes? Their smile? What makes you precious? Every child in the whole world is precious. When you look at the stars, remember that you are precious.

Short Prayer: "Dear God, thank you that children are precious. Thank you that each of us is very precious. Amen."

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know...say "We're Precious!" ...

Story 4: Stars to Count (Genesis 12 - 15)

There once was a couple called Abram and Sarah. They had been married a long time, but still had no children. They were very sad.

One day God came to Abram. "Abram, leave your country, and I will show you where to go. I promise to give you a family."

They packed up their house. They put everything on camels and donkeys. They took their sheep. They took their nephew, Lot, as well. Then they set off, not knowing where they were going. They walked for hundreds of miles.

 - Princess and servants

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): How was brave in this story? How can we be brave? **Short Prayer:** "Dear God, help us to be brave and do what is right. Amen."

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know it...be brave!

Story 5: "Baby in a Basket" (Exodus 2)

A long time ago a family grew big in Egypt. Pharaoh got worried. "This family is getting powerful. Soldiers, make them my slaves."

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "Burning Bush" (Exodus 3)

Materials needed: Red cloth for fire Grey cloth for bush Staff Mountain Cast: Narrator Moses God Slaves

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): It is sometimes hard to follow your teacher's instructions? What can we do to help us listen better to our teachers?

Short Prayer: "Dear God, help us to listen to our teachers. Help us to do what is right. Amen."

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know it...Don't Complain!

"Story 6: Burning Bush" (Exodus 3)

Puppet Introduces Theme: Use the washing line, clothes pegs, three event picture and "Spheres to stop" card.

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "When the Sun Stopped" (Joshua 10) Materials needed:

Five crowns Swords Message Brown cloth for city of Gibeon Cast: Narrator Joshua Five kings Gibeon

Runner

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): No one likes to be bullied. But sometimes it is easy to pick on others, to not like something about them. How can we stop teasing others?

Short Prayer: "Dear God, none of us likes to be bullied. Help us to be kind to everyone. Amen."

Sing a song: If You're Happy and You Know...say, "Be kind!" ...

Story 7: "When the Sun Stopped" (Joshua 10)

It took four hundred years for Abraham's people to turn into millions of people. Soon they wanted a good leader. God gave them Joshua.

All the cities around them thought Joshua was strong, and that he might take them over. They were petrified. Only one small city called Gibeon wanted to be friends. They had a meal with Joshua and promised to be kind to each other.

Puppet Introduces Theme: A puppet has a special place where he keeps his special marbles. Another puppet sees the marbles and plays with them. The first puppet says that they are special, and the second one says sorry.

Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "A Special Place" (2 Samuel 7)

Materials needed:

Rectangle Box and yellow cloth Angels for Ark of God Tent Throne Cast: Narrator Craftsman King David Priests

Puppets Chat on Theme (interactive): Do you have a place that is special to you? Your room? A tree house? A secret place? What makes it special to you? **Short Prayer:** "Dear God, thank you for special places. Help us to respect what is special to other people. Amen.

Sing a song: If you're Happy and You Know It...Show Respect! ...

...Pat your head

Story 8: "A Special Place" (2 Samuel 7)

There was one thing God wanted more than anything else. He wanted to be with His people. But there was a problem. People couldn't see him. What was God going to do?

He found a craftsman who worked with metal. "Craftsman, make me a chest, shaped like a rectangle. Then cover it with gold. Put two golden angels on top. This will remind people of me. They can even talk with me there."

The craftsman did exactly what God said. He called it the Ark of God, and put it in a special tent. Soon people came to listen and talk with God.

When David became king, he wanted to be with God. But the Ark was in a tiny village far away, and David had to live in the city. "What can I do?" said David.

Welcome: MC welcomes children, introduces Fun Fish and theme. Everyone can listen and learn. Everyone can be wise.

Memory Line: "For everything God made is good." (1 Timothy 4:4)

Sing a Song:

Puppet Introduces Theme: What does it mean to be wise? Is it someone with a big head? Or someone who is clever? What makes a person wise? When they listen and learn. Manger Card.Bible Story (spontaneous drama with children): "Who is the Wiseman?"

Materials needed:

Baby Jesus and a manger

Star

- Sheep for shepherds
- Gifts, crowns for wise men
- Blanket and pillow
- White cloth for angels

Cast: Narrator

Shepherds Wise men Angels People wrapped in blankets King on his kingly pillow
